Recently I came across a post on Facebook by a mother whose son has profound Autism. She said that according to a 2023 CDC study, 27% of children (1 in 4) on the Autism Spectrum have a profound condition. Yet, social and mainstream media paint them as just different geniuses and savants—the Rain Man, the Good Doctor, Young Sheldon, Temple Grandin—and no one talks about Autists who cannot speak, cannot communicate, cannot control their physical and emotional lives and need care 24/7.

The Facebook is full of parents groups which provide useful information and advice to parents. But it seems that this is just not enough. I quote from her: "...I left many autism-related Facebook groups. The conversations there weren't about the kind of autism my son has. Instead, I often felt belittled—made to feel small, like an inadequate parent.



The moms of (these) groups share incredible stories of overcoming barriers, of achievements, of ambitions that feel like distant dreams for us."

She goes on to say that not only society, but science also has failed children with profound autism as the research continues to focus on therapies and teaching methodologies for higher functioning children on the Spectrum.

Autism advocates also concentrate on mind-boggling self-analysis as was evident in this year's Neurodiversity Week celebrated online in March. Please do Google these discussions just to understand how great the chasm is within the Spectrum.

And next time you meet someone whose child has a profound condition, be kind. Open your mind and heart and embrace the caregiver.




Shah Ali Colony Tando Allahyar, AKU School Sultanabad




Session with Echo
